New spellings will be sent home **each Tuesday** to be practised during the week at home and tested the following **Tuesday** due to bank holidays this term— See dates below.

Pupils also have a Spelling Shed account (login details are in their Reading Record Book), that gives them access to the online games which will support them in learning the weekly spellings. We would like children to spend <u>at least 10 minutes per week</u> playing these games as it will really help strengthen their recall.

In the spelling test we **may** also include other words with the same spelling pattern to see if they can apply the rule, spellings from previous weeks as well as some of the Year 3/4 statutory spelling words that we will also have been looking at in school. (See next page)
