Below are some Home Learning ideas for you to do with your family. How many can you complete? Remember to upload your activities to your Tapestry account or bring in any work you complete. All activities have a fine motor focus to develop those finger muscles ready for writing.

Peg it on! Using some clothes pegs, put them around the rim of a pot or container. You could extend this by pegging socks or slips of paper on to a clothes airer. The slips of paper could have the letter sounds we have covered so far or numbers on them. You could even add a timer – how many pegs in 1, 3, or 5 mins.	Perfect pasta Pasta tubes make great beads for threading along string, wool or even an old shoe lace. For some added creativity, paint the pasta the day before and make a pattern. Use spaghetti strands stuck into playdough or blue tack to then thread on Cheerios or other cereal hoops.	Snip Snip Get a pair of scissors and some old magazines/adverts/junk mail. Create a wide range of pictures/ collages with the shapes they cut out. Arrange as faces, aliens, flowers or anything you fancy. No need to stick down, just place the pieces, photograph and re-arrange.
Playdough Whether you pinch, roll or squeeze it; make a whole range of shapes, animals and people. You can snip it with scissors, slice with a knife or poke with a fork to create a wide range of patterns. If you don't have any, it is easy to make at home recipes easily found online.	Water painting With the last of the dry days this year grab your coat, a pot of water and an old paintbrush. Paint pictures and patterns on the path, patio or even on the wall outside.	Follow the line. On a sheet of paper draw some simple shapes, swirls and spirals. Place things such as pasta, buttons, pompoms or counters along and between the lines. You could even use smarties or skittles to make edible patterns!
